Dear Madam Superintendent and District 86 Board of Education Members,

I am writing this letter of interest in order to be appointed as a District 86 Board of Education Member. My love of education began at an early age, as I grew up learning German, Arabic and later English at the age of seven. My parents immigrated to the United States from Egypt, and when they were deciding where to live, education and schools were one of the major deciding factors. My father is a professor of engineering, and spent countless nights helping my sister and me study for our difficult science and math classes, as well as our ACTs and SATs. I graduated in the top 5% of my class, and enrolled in a B.S./M.D. program in Ohio. Now, years later, I have followed in my parents' footsteps. I married someone who earned a Ph.D. in Mathematics and shares the same love for education. We chose to live in Hinsdale knowing that this is one of the best school systems around and feel comfortable and happy knowing our location. I share all this to give you a background in how important education and schools have played a part of my life.

During college, medical school and residency, I took classes that taught me about child and adolescent development. I worked with (and still occasionally do) children and adolescents in the outpatient, hospital and emergency room settings; as well as with social workers in several different systems that provide wraparound services to children and teenagers in need. I have an excellent understanding of mental health issues in children and adolescents, most commonly anxiety, depression and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, all of which can have a profound impact on learning if left undetected and untreated.

Although I am a physician and take care of patients, I am also very much an administrator and an educator. I have progressed from Clinical Instructor to Assistant Professor, and now to Associate Professor of Psychiatry, at Loyola University Stritch School of Medicine. I work closely teaching and mentoring medical students and resident physicians. I teach lectures and present grand rounds at all levels, including medical students, psychiatry residents, as well as physicians in other specialties including neurology, pediatrics and internal medicine. I have been invited to speak nationally, as well as have presented teaching workshops for psychiatrists on various topics. I sit on multiple committees, both at a department level, as well as hospital level, and am a co-chair of a committee at the national level. Further, I have created and now lead several professional Facebook groups which promote networking and education. I am very familiar with the idea of using both social media for education, as well as virtual learning through other platforms such as Zoom and WebEx. I have created my own virtual lectures and journal club series which have allowed many physicians to earn CME. Finally, I created and ran two conferences, the only ones available targeted specifically for women psychiatrists, for which physicians gathered together, learned as they earned CME and networked with one another. This I tell you, to explain that the work that I do day-to-day is strongly linked to education.

Taking into account my years of commitment to training, clinical care and administration, if I could choose one overarching theme of what my work is like, it would be that of innovation. Whenever I am a part of anything, whether it is developing the curriculum for our psychiatry resident didactics or assessing the barriers for women physicians when applying for academic promotion, I can envision a solution and I have the drive to ensure it happens. For example, at Loyola University this year I created a project in which senior women physicians and researchers coach their juniors throughout the academic promotion process, and I anticipate to have a higher number than usual women submit applications this year and earn promotion.

To summarize, I love education and communication, and enjoy complex challenges, particularly ones that have an impact on our immediate surroundings and community. I have leadership and team experience, which are key components in being a part of the District 86 Board of Education. I have direct clinical experience as well as didactic experience in child and adolescent development and psychiatry. I understand that there would be a lot of information to learn and understand, which does not daunt me, as I am a fast learner, and am adaptable. I have many ideas and have the drive to bring them to fruition but understand that practicality also deserves consideration. And while all these qualities are helpful to have in a board member, I would be remiss not to mention that being a physician, particularly a psychiatrist, is a unique advantage and will be a tremendous asset to the board.




