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

Update on Curriculum Night

In her Aug. 13 message to the community about the district's plan for opening the 2021-22 school year, Superintendent Tammy Prentiss shared that the status of certain events would be based, in large part, on the community transmission level (low, moderate, substantial or high) for DuPage County. Since the current transmission level for the county is high, the Sept. 9 Curriculum Night for Hinsdale Central and Hinsdale South is being shifted to a virtual format.



Each building will be providing their families with a detailed update about the event. In the meantime, please contact your child's school if you have any questions.

Back-to-School Survey for Families

Starting this year, District 86 will be working with Panorama Education to administer feedback surveys to our students, faculty, staff and families on an annual basis. These surveys will provide us with valuable insights and information that will enable us to build upon our strengths. They will also help us better understand our opportunities for improvement and develop strategies and solutions for addressing them. These efforts are being



undertaken in conjunction with the mission, vision, values and goals of our strategic plan, which include strengthening connections with our stakeholders and giving them a voice in the work we are doing to guide our students down the path toward their ideal future.

The first survey we are administering is our back-to-school survey for families. This brief survey (33 questions that will take approximately 11 minutes to complete) will give parents/guardians the chance to share their thoughts on several topics, including student needs, family-school communication and school public health measures. Participation in this process will be completely confidential - i.e., Panorama will not share people's individual responses with their child's school or the district.

Parents/guardians will receive an email on Sept. 9 that will include additional information about the survey and a link they can use to access it. The deadline for completing the survey is Sept. 24 at 4 p.m.


"Inside the Classroom" Video Series



Boys and Girls Golf


The boys and girls golf teams from Hinsdale Central and Hinsdale South turned in outstanding performances at their recent conference tournaments.




Mr. Brogan has created in the class, which are helping his students develop skills and form bonds that will benefit them throughout their lives.



The boys and girls golf teams from Hinsdale Central and Hinsdale South had phenomenal finishes to their seasons.


Sectionals

We congratulate the teams and individual student-athletes on their incredible success this year.










Girls Tennis


